Units of Study:



Unit 1: The Alphabet

- Identify sounds of letters in the target language enforcing the sounds of each vowel;
- Spell various words and recognize sounds of each letter;
- Ask guestions of others (how to spell their names and certain words);
- Compare Spanish and English alphabet; and
- Pronounce vowels in target language.

Unit 2: Greetings and Courtesy Expressions

- Discuss reasons to learn a new language;
- Recognize basic classroom commands;
- Express simple greetings and expressions in target language;
- Identify people using formal titles;
- Introduce oneself and ask questions of others;
- Use the verb ser and subject pronouns; and
- Identify cognates when reading small text.

Unit 3: Using Numbers

- Use numbers to count, tell time and communicate telephone numbers;
- Express dates in target language;
- Count from 0-31 in target language;
- Ask questions of others;
- Use the verb ser:
- Use appropriate punctuation; and
- Identify subjects and verbs in target language.

Unit 4: Describing People and Things

- Describe people and things using adjectives and certain color words;
- Differentiate between masculine and feminine nouns;
- Use and recognize masculine/ feminine and singular and plural nouns and definite articles;
- Use and recognize appropriate adjectives when describing masculine/feminine/singular/plural people or thing;
- Form guestions about people and things using various guestions words and respond to various guestions;
- Identify subjects in sentences and determine its gender;
- Identify color words in the target language; and
- Pronounce terms in the target language.

Unit 5: Likes and Dislikes

- Talk about what others like and dislike;
- Use the verb gustar with singular and plural nouns;
- Use adjectives to say why like or dislike something;
- Use correct object pronouns before the verb gustar;
- Ask questions of others;
- Respond to questions both positively and negatively about likes and dislikes; and
- Use "Porque" "ser" and adjectives to respond to "why" questions.

Unit 6: Pastime Activities and Sports

- Describe likes and dislikes in target language;
- Ask questions of others in target language;
- Use regular -ar verbs when talking about things I and others do;
- Extend an invitation to others in target language;
- Describe the weather;
- Identify various activities for appropriate weather conditions; and
- Use phrases/vocabulary words in simple conversations.



Units of Study:



Unit 7: School Life

- Talk about classes, school and class schedules in target language;
- Identify school supplies;
- Discuss arrival times in target language;
- Describe places in and surrounding the school building;
- Use "how much" and "how many" when asking questions of others in target language; and
- Understand language heard through video, music, or in person.

Unit 8: The Family

- Use adjectives and possessive adjectives to describe physical characteristics, personality traits, family relationships.
- Ask and answer questions in target language; and
- Recognize how surnames are given in Spanish speaking countries and how they change when women marry.

Unit 9: The House and The Neighborhood

- Identify rooms in a place in target language;
- Describe where things are located in relation to others;
- Name chores in target language using verb tocar;
- Express feelings using the verb parecer; and
- Talk about where one lives and identify address in target language.

Unit 10: Let's Eat

- Identify foods and describe them using "ser" and "Estar";
- Sort foods into categories;
- Place an order at a restaurant in target language; and
- Explain how to make simple recipes using commands in the target language.

Unit 11: Spain

- Identify major geographical aspects of Spain;
- Discuss culturally authentic food;
- Identify and describe some culturally authentic sports;
- Build an understanding of historical points in Spain's history;
- Compare and contrast cultures; and
- Discuss tourism in the target country.

Unit 12: Puerto Rico

- Identify major Geographical aspects of Puerto Rico;
- Explore culturally authentic food;
- Identify and describe culturally authentic sports;
- Explore and build understanding of historical points in Puerto Rico history;
- Compare and contrast their own culture to the one in Puerto Rico;
- Identify some tourist points in Puerto Rico; and
- Identify some culturally authentic foods and celebrations.

Unit 13: Costa Rica

- Identify major geographical aspects of Costa Rica;
- Discuss culturally authentic foods, art, music and celebrations;
- Understand historical points in Costa Rica's history and compare to their own history; and
- Compare and contrast cultures and discuss tourism in the target country.
